Who We Are

The Blueridge Community Association (BCA) was founded in October 1992 to oppose the development of a Hyannis Connector Road that would have linked Hyannis Drive with Lynn Valley.

In 1995 the BCA opposed another proposed development project, Cove and Mountain Forest, north of Blueridge, which would have added over 2000 residences to the forested lands north and west of Blueridge.

Since that time, the BCA has developed into an association that is an important voice for our community. The BCA actively organizes and promotes events that highlight Blueridge/Seymour Heights. Held every year since 1998, the most high-profile event is Blueridge Good Neighbour Day, which often surpasses 800 participants.

The BCA co-hosts all-candidates meetings for every single election at all three levels of government - municipal, provincial and federal. Other sub-committees hosted within the BCA are:

- Traffic and Safety Committee
- Trails Committee
