Traffic and Trails Update

In the January 2021 Blueridge Bulletin, we advertised a Zoom Meeting on Traffic and Parking in Blueridge. The following is an update of the Thursday, January 14th Zoom meeting. The Zoom

Crowds:

- o Limited street parking available for residents;*
- o Trails are busy;*
- o COVID concerns about physical distancing and mask-wearing where physical distancing is not being maintained (particularly at Berkley and Hyannis); and*

meeting was attended by 46 participants, including Mayor Mike Little and Councillors Betty Forbes and Jordan Back. The intent of the meeting was to initiate a dialogue respecting traffic and parking in the Blueridge area, and to discuss potential, Blueridge-wide solutions to the issues.

General consensus arose that:

- ***The trails are to be shared by the public;***
- ***The affected groups need to work collaboratively in coming to possible solutions;***
and
- ***Residents and their homes need to be respected.***

Some of the key increased traffic and parking issues include:

Safety:

- o Obstructed views and unsafe exits from driveways;
- o Narrow “choke points” including at Berkley Avenue between Blueridge Park and Hyannis Drive;
- o Unsafe driving including speeding, U-turns and reversing into intersection at Hyannis and Berkley Avenue, and forced driving in oncoming lanes due to inappropriate parking; and
- o Lack of a crosswalk for the overwhelming pedestrian traffic at Hyannis and Berkley Avenue.

o Bad behavior including littering, lawn and property damage, and noise (particularly early in the morning and late at night).

Bylaws:

o Calling bylaws is becoming necessary to manage the parking situation as cars regularly contravene the 2 metres from driveways, 6 metres from a stop sign or crosswalk, 11 metres from an intersection, and 5 metres from a fire hydrant bylaws.

A Task Force has been struck to assist the BCA in achieving a balance between increased safety and livability in the affected area, while facilitating public access to the trail network. The members of the Task Force are David Hannah (Chair), Eric Andersen, Amy Pankratz, Linda Dong, Graham Gilley, and Jennifer Brun.

Presently, the Task Force is working to educate visitors to our neighbourhood with respect to DNV parking and nuisance bylaws already in force, through the development of a pamphlet in association with the North Shore Mountain Biking Association. The Task Force is also in communication with the DNV respecting the placement of signage to advise visitors of the existing parking bylaws and speed limits. RE: Vandalism at the Sharing Garden

I am involved with The Sharing Garden off Carnation, a walk thru path, a gathering place and a garden where the ones renting a plot come together and learn as we grow together. Some of the harvest gets sold at United Strangers coffee shop, others gets donated to charities when we can outside of Covid time and we also are lucky to have some of our own veggies to enjoy.

It is a garden space where we encourage people of all ages to visit and volunteer.

This year we have had some disappointing events involving mostly youth that have wreaked havoc on the platform, covered area and shed. It has been privy to b&e, vandalism, destruction, and arson - most of which were not caught on camera but mentioning because if they were then we would have submitted this footage and called 911.

We now have multiple cameras and perhaps it is only a matter of time. None of us in our community actively wants to report these youth but if it's a matter of safety as in fire, vandalism or b&e we will do so. We as a group have drafted a letter that perhaps you would consider [sharing]? We really do need your help.

Dear Garden Visitors and Community Neighbours,

As many of you know, we have had problems with vandalism, break and enter and arson at the Blueridge Garden in recent months. This garden sits along the path off Carnation St. and connects to Lytton St. Because of this vandalism we have placed cameras around the garden to monitor the space. We have posted notices about our cameras in the hopes that it would act as a deterrent.

To the girl who regularly waves to one of our cameras as she passes, thanks for the wave. To the group of kids who apologized and cleaned up a Christmas ornament after their friend smashed it, thanks for picking up after your friends. To the many high school students rolling joints, smoking bongs, drinking beers, we see you. To the kid who lost his canister of weed, it was found under the garden Christmas tree (no joke)! To the couple that brings a towel to sit on while getting high on various substances, we see you. And most recently to the kids who tagged the shed and the bench, we see you too.

We write this letter to let you know that the cameras are real and we have video footage of all of these actions. We have been encouraged by the RCMP to report the 911 footage. Another consideration is to share the footage with parents to deal with internally first if we know the youth and if caught again then go to the Police. With guidance and RCMP support we will determine next best steps.

This is a community space and you are a part of our community, so we ask you use this space respectfully. So please, enjoy the garden and keep the space clean and respected for all.
