### Clean Beach Challenge

Each year, 18 billion pounds of plastic flow into our ocean systems, according to a [National Geographic report](#). The effects of this on a global scale have been enormous, with scientists reporting at least **700 marine species facing serious difficulties due to plastic pollution**. Our oceans are, in fact, filled with so much plastic trash, it is estimated they will contain **more plastic than fish** by the year 2050. A combination of sun and friction from the water breaks down plastic items into **microplastics** that are ingested by fish and marine animals.

Currently the **Great Pacific Garbage Patch, or Plastic Island** as it's commonly referred to, is the



A beach clean up is an opportunity to gather fresh data about the health of our coastlines and the type of litter that pollutes them. By identifying the most harmful and abundant debris items, environmental groups can find ways to stop them from entering the ocean and impacting wildlife.

In 2020, our group continued our annual initiative of collecting 2200lbs of litter and debris through a series of campaigns targeted at beaches around the Greater Vancouver area. From the Spring to Fall season we visited:

*Deep Cove/Panorama Park - Cates Park - Lynn Creek - Dundarave - Ambleside Beach - Sandy Cove -*

largest plastic accumulation in the ocean located in the Northern Pacific Ocean between Hawaii and California. This patch has a surface area of 1.6 million km<sup>2</sup>, twice the size of Texas.

Meantime on our beaches, a 2006 United Nations Environment Program (UNEP) study estimated 1 million seabirds as well as 100,000 sea mammals die from mistaking plastic for food every year. The increase in plastic, namely plastic bags, bottles and straws, are the main cause of environmental damage to our beaches.

A beach clean up is a volunteer coordination among concerned citizens that takes place regularly along coastlines around the world. People work to collect beach trash to make these systems a nicer and safer place for everyone. Cleaning the beach improves the coastal and oceanic ecosystem by ensuring that we minimize the impact on the marine life cycle.

With a combined tally since we first started, we look forward to tipping the scales on the 10,000 pound mark this year.
