Oct 20!](#) Get out and Vote! Read on for upcoming events in our area.

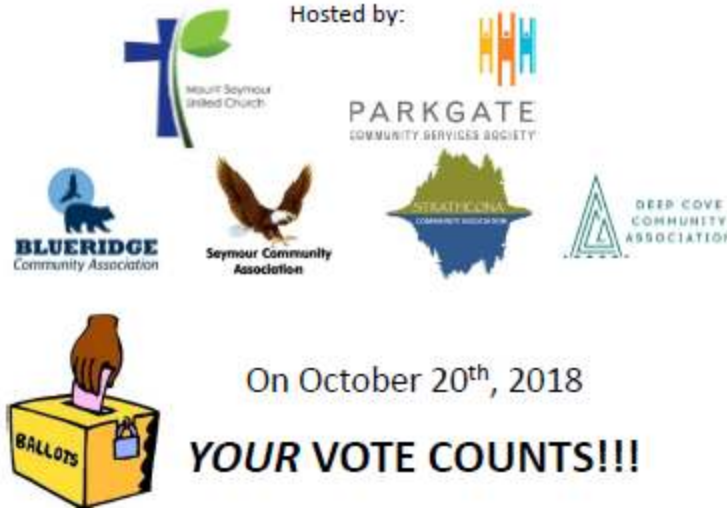
DNV MUNICIPAL ELECTION ALL CANDIDATES MEETING

Confused about the upcoming provincial referendum on whether you want Proportional Representation (PR) instead of the current First Past The Post voting method? You will be asked to specify which of three PR voting systems you are in favour of, if PR were to be preferred by the majority of voters.

Mount Seymour United Church, Parkgate Community Services Society, the Blueridge Community Association, the Seymour Community Association, the Strathcona Community Association and the Deep Cove Community Association are very pleased to co-host a special session related to the provincial 2018 Referendum on Electoral Reform at **Mary Hunter Hall at Parkgate on Monday, October 22, at 7 PM.** It will be facilitated by Dr. Conrad King of Capilano University.

Around October 22 all residents in B.C. will receive a mail-in ballot which will have to be returned to Elections BC by November 30.

Voters will be asked two questions on the referendum ballot. The first question asks if we should keep the current First Past the Post voting system or move to a system of proportional representation. The second question asks voters to rank three proportional systems: Dual Member Proportional (DMP), Mixed Member Proportional (MMP), and Rural-Urban Proportional (RUP).

Space is limited; arrive early at the Mary Hunter Hall, R11 (located inside Parkgate Community Centre)



Curious about the developments on the new "Twin Bridge"? So are we! We have reached out for further information, but at this point all Metro Vancouver can say is this: "Twin Bridges Trail and a section of Fisherman's Trail (between Homestead and Twin bridges) will be closed 7 days a week for the duration of the project until the bridge is open to the public in late summer.

Understanding climate change: Is the past the key to the future?

A talk for Parkgate library, District of North Vancouver.

Speaker: David Cook, Geologist/Biologist

Description: David will summarize what is known, not known or surmised about climate change and how climate change has been around throughout geological history. He will discuss a variable that has come into play in recent times; the ascendancy of one species and the by-products of its accompanying industrialization. He will attempt to decode past and present climates as a lead-up to what we may expect in the future.
