Blueridge Bulletin – February 1, 2015

A lot has been happening in the Blueridge/Seymour Heights neighbourhood this last month. Here are some updates.

2) The BCA hosted a very successful Newcomer’s Meeting on Tuesday January 13th. It was such a great evening connecting with new people in Blueridge/Seymour Heights. Lots of families with young children are moving here – drawn by the trees, the community-feeling, the close proximity to schools and trails and the large lot sizes. We will definitely host another meeting in the future – so don’t worry if you missed out! 3) BlockWatch update. There was a recent break-in (on a Thursday afternoon) in the 1200 Block of Berkley. This is a good time to remind everyone to stay in touch with your local BlockWatch captain and keep an eye out for suspicious activity in the neighbourhood. The goal of Block Watch is to build a crime-free British Columbia through community participation. It is a program to help neighbours watch out for neighbours. It aims to get citizens involved in crime prevention at the local level. The ultimate success of Block Watch depends largely on a commitment to cooperate between area residents and the police – and more importantly, between residents themselves.
