New BCA fundraising – Bottle drive made easy!

Since we need funding for many of our projects and to pay for our on-going expenses, we would like to suggest 'Fundraise with Express', now offered by Return-It.

This is how it works: Take your unsorted containers in standard-size transparent recycling bags (70-75 litres in size) to the Return-It depots on Brooksbank Avenue or Riverside Drive. At the label stand, log in using our account phone number which is 604 767 0970, print off labels, tag each bag and leave them with Return-It. They will sort the bottles and cans and credit the refund to our Express account. To skip the depot's tagging lines, [contact us](#) for the physical stickers to attach to your bags.

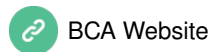
