LET'S IMPROVE THE 214 TOGETHER!

My husband and I moved to the area in 2016. One of the reasons we chose Blueridge was because of the great transit, specifically the 214 bus. We are a one-car household and I work downtown; I can take the bus around the corner from my house and get off at Granville & Pender, which is around the corner from my office! In the evenings, after work or industry events, I can easily take the bus to Phibbs, switch to the 214 and be home efficiently – how convenient! This is great in theory but in practice it has been unreliable and often frustrating.

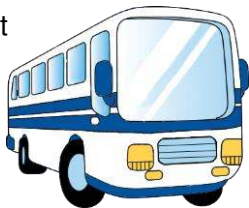
The issues I personally have encountered are: reduced services from Blueridge to downtown, no show buses on both ends of my commute, and 214 buses at Phibbs not allowing the promised overlap of time between the downtown buses arriving and it leaving.

I emailed the BCA to understand if I was the only one who felt this way – it turns out I am not alone. I learned that others had similar experiences, some drive down to Seymour Pkwy to catch the 211, others drive to Phibbs for the 210/211! How many more alternate commuting methods are there? This is unacceptable.

I see 2 main reasons transit is the way of the future: 1) our city is increasing in density, and 2) it makes environmental sense. The DNV addresses both of these issues. In the DNV the Transportation Plan commits to increasing transit, and as they are part of the BC climate action charter, committing to reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. Right in the Transportation Plan, it states that their objective is to “support the delivery of an enhanced and more integrated transit system across the community”. This sounds like the DNV would then support our desire to have reliable and efficient service.

So, what now? The BCA has put together a survey for us to fill out. Please take the time to answer it!

Translink needs to know that they have riders in the area, the DNV needs to know that transit service is not as promised to their constituents or in line with their plan and for those like me, it would be nice to know we're not alone!
