Volunteer Coordinator Needed

The BCA runs on volunteers. Every BCA project and program only happens because community members volunteer their time and effort to make them come together. As a result, we always have volunteer positions open, and now is no exception.

The biggest opening at the moment is for a new **Volunteer Coordinator**. This role helps connect community members with BCA projects. New Lawn Watering Rules

Yes this is a repeat, but it's important! Fines are possible if we get this wrong.

Every year between May 1 and October 15 the Metro Vancouver area goes into Stage 1 water use restrictions. During this period water use goes way up (on average) but rainfall drops significantly, so our levels in our local reservoirs drop. To avoid water shortages, the Stage 1 rules are put in place. A few apply to homeowners, but the most significant is the limit on when we are allowed to water our lawns.

In the past we were allowed to water twice a week, but that has now changed.

The new rules allow watering the lawn only **once a week**, and the fines for non-compliance have gone up.

The new rules are:

- Even-numbered addresses can water lawns only on Saturdays
- Odd-numbered addresses can water lawns only on Sundays
- 5 a.m. to 7 a.m. for automated lawn watering
- 6 a.m. to 9 a.m. for manual lawn watering

Hand watering and drip irrigation of other plants is still allowed from 5 am to 9 am any day. More information is available [here](#):

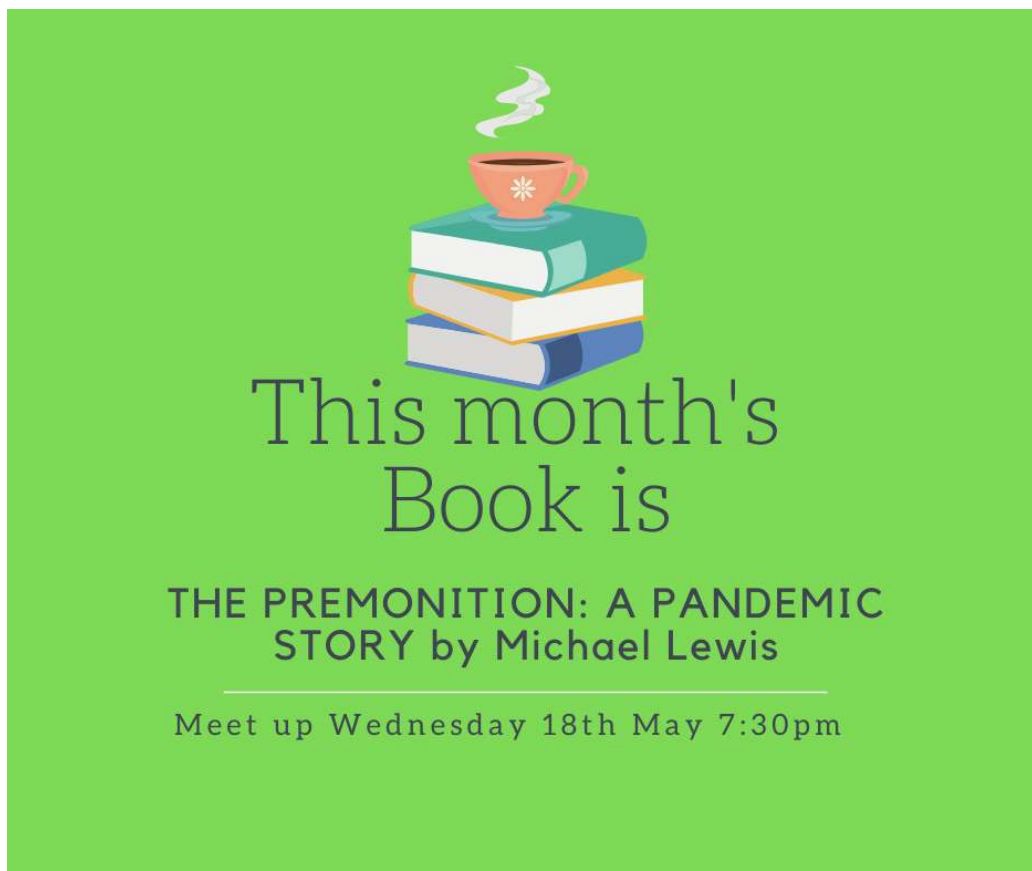
