Plant Stand

Have you had a chance to visit this sweet little stand located just south of Carnation on Berkley? It's the brainchild of Maya Aubron-Albert, a grade 12 student at Windsor (whom you'll read more about in the next article as well). Maya and her father kindly agreed to tell us a bit about the plant stand in a recent interview. Read on!

Q: Who came up with the idea of the plant swap or how did it come about?

A: My daughter Maya Aubron-Albert, Grade 12, Windsor. She loves plants and has a lot in her bedroom, everywhere in the house actually.

Q: What has been most gratifying about hosting a plant swap?

A: Meeting and speaking with neighbours and seeing a turn over every week on the Plant Swap.

Q: Tell us about some of the plants that you've seen left/traded.

A: I've seen orchids, lavender, many veggies (tomatoes, peppers, cucumbers...), small bushes, flowers, a lot!

Q: What is your favourite plant?

A: Monstera Deliciosa, an indoor plant, and Lavender for outdoor.

Q: Do you have any requests or reminders for neighbours regarding the swap?

A: Yes it is a swap, so people have to bring a plant as well!

Q: How did the stand come to be purple?

A: Maya chose the colours. She decided to buy bright colours for the swap to be seen easily.

Q: Who built it the plant stand?

A: Maya and her dad.

Q: How long has it been around now?

A: This is the second year, April to September. It works very well! We are so happy!

Bears In Blueridge

Most of us moved to Blueridge because we wanted to be close to nature, as not many neighborhoods are surrounded by beautiful forest on three sides, with forested trails connecting many of our streets. Recently, Blueridge residents have been reporting lots of bear sightings, which makes sense because bears are part of our local environment, along with coyotes, owls, eagles, skunks, raccoons and exciting recent sightings of the return of pine martens.

It will be open until June 19, 2022. There is also an in-person open house on June 8 and several virtual open houses on this issue if you like. All the information is available [here](#).



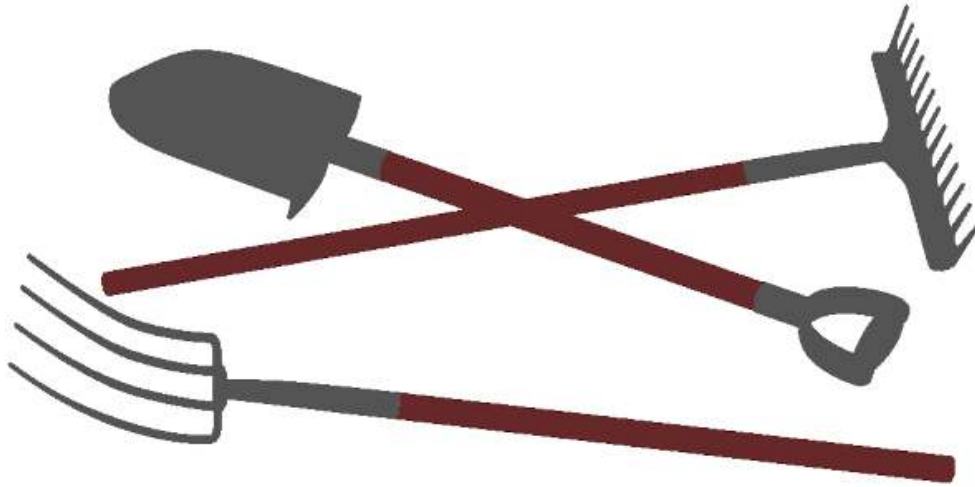
Garage Sale


